CAEN LA MER IN 10 PLACES



>L'ABBAYE AUX HOMMES

An architectural gem illustrating medieval and 18th century art. The Abbey was consecrated in 1077. The monastery was built in the 11th century, and rebuilt in the 18th century after having been destroyed during the wars of religion. It survived unscathed through the French Revolution and the Allied bombing in 1944 and displays a remarkable collection of wooden paneling, paintings and ironwork, as well as a superb cloister in Tuscany style.



>L'ABBAYE AUX DAMES

The church was consecrated in 1066, the same year as William set out to conquer England, and is a masterpiece of Norman Romanesque architecture. Its crypt houses a «forest of columns». Like the Abbaye aux Hommes, the convent buildings were rebuilt in the 18th century. All that remains of the original abbey is the entrance hall, the refectory, the stairs and the cloister (lacking its fourth wing).



>CAEN CASTLE

The castle, right in the heart of the city, is one of Europe's largest fortified strongholds. From the castle, you can see right across the city center. The remaining walls and its interpretation center in Saint George's Church, bring it to life as it stood through centuries past. Visit: The Exchequer Room, a rare example of civilian Romanesque architecture in Normandy at the time of Henry I Beauclerc.



>ORNAVIK

An experimental archaeological project where visitors can learn what techniques and materials were used to build, forge, weave and cultivate the land in the 10th and 11th centuries. Ornavik gives visitors the opportunity to immerse themselves in early medieval Normandy, to experience the life of the Vikings and to take part in the adventure, on a protected natural site near Caen.



>PARKS AND GARDENS

Caen is France's fifth greenest city. It has 500 hectares (over 1,200 acres) of green spaces spread throughout the city, representing 25% of the total city area. Parks, gardens and natural areas where you can relax, wander or play a sport, right in the heart of the city!



>LE MÉMORIAL DE CAEN

This is a must-see for any visitor interested in WWII history. It revisits 20th century history from the end of the First World War to the fall of the Berlin Wall, with the Second World War and the Battle of Normandy at the heart of the narrative. The Museum is now recognized as one of Europe's finest memorial museums. Its exhibition know-how, and its cultural, pedagogical or scientific excellence are now recognized the world over.



>SWORD BEACH

One of the 5 D-Day Beaches where 177 French marines led by Commander Kieffer arrived on June 6, 1944.

The Hillman site: This was a command center for the coastal defense system including 20 concrete bunkers and gun emplacements at Colleville-Montgomery.

The Great Bunker in Ouistreham: Housed the German headquarters. It has been entirely restored, with its five floors: infirmary, machine room, pharmacy, armory, radio transmissions, telephone exchange, observation post, etc.



>SEASIDE RESORTS

Yes, Caen la Mer... is by the sea! Ouistreham Riva-Bella, the local seaside resort, is just 15km (10 miles) from the city center, on the Côte de Nacre (Mother of Pearl Coast). It is lively all year round and has plenty of things to do and see. Colleville-Montgomery, Lion-sur-mer, Hermanville-sur-mer: so many authentic resorts with typical and family charm.



>THE TYPICAL CÔTE DE NACRE SEASIDE ARCHITECTURE

Normandy would not be Normandy without its typical seaside resort architecture. The Côte de Nacre (Mother of Pearl Coast), and more particularly, the embankment between Lion-sur-mer and Hermanville-sur-mer, boasts a number of superb Art Nouveau seaside villas, and others in a range of architectural styles, from English and Scottish, to Norman and Gothic!



>THE CANAL

You can cycle, walk or roller-skate all the way to the sea along Caen's 15km (10 miles) canal. Starting from the marina right in the heart of the city, the canal path takes you past «Little Lourdes» (a chapel built on the same model as the real Lourdes sanctuary), Benouville Castle (a French neoclassical masterpiece built in the 18th century by Claude Nicola Ledoux) and the famous Pegasus Bridge (the first bridge taken by British commandos during the D-Day landings on June 5-6 1944).



Jeannette Biscuit Factory (Entreprise du Patrimoine Vivant)

The company has been producing madeleine biscuits in Caen since 1850. The new production site features a glass gallery where visitors can watch the various madeleinemaking processes, learn about the company's turbulent history and taste the delicious madeleines.

Mesnil de Bavent Pottery (Entreprise du Patrimoine Vivant)

175 years of expertise – the pottery, located near the pays d'Auge, specialises in finials, a landmark feature on the local rooftops! The visit will take you round the workshop and take in an exhibition on the history of finials and the artisan village.

Visit Saint Vaast farm

Welcome to Normandy, the world's leading linen fiber producing area. Mathilde and Benoît, from a long line of linen growers, welcome visitors on their Saint Vaast farm, 10 minutes south of Caen. Mathilde first explains all about linen production through the ages, linen in figures, farming, linen growing, linen processing, linen as a textile and technical applications. She then takes you on a tour of the farm and its farm equipment.

Tour of the Filt1860 plant (Entreprise du Patrimoine Vivant)

This is a Normandy factory that has been making nets and braids since 1860, combining tradition, know-how, technical skill and innovation. During the tour you can find out about the history of the company and how the famous net shopping bags are made in the workshops, along with other products, before a visit to the shop.

The price includes: Tour of the selected company, lunch including a 3-course menu and drinks (1/4 litre of wine, coffee) and visit to Caen. Bayeux

This unique masterpiece is listed in UNESCO's Memory of the World Register.

A day trip in Normandy to historical must-see sites...

Caen Memorial

The museum helps you experience the history of the $20^{\rm th}$ century, from the origins of the Second World War to the end of the Cold War. A large space is dedicated to D-Day and the Battle of Normandy.

OR

Arromanches Museum

This was the first museum opened on the D-Day theme after the Second World War. It shows how Mulberry B Harbour was built, while the remains of the real harbour can still be seen just outside the museum. The museum moved into a new building in 2023.

The Normandy Landings beaches

This is a chance to see the main sites where the fate of the country played out on 6 June 1944: the Mulberry Harbour in Arromanches, the German battery in Longues-sur-Mer, the US cemetery in Colleville-sur-Mer and Omaha Beach

See the little-known D-Day sites close to Caen...

Sword Beach

This was one of the five iconic D-Day beaches, where 177 French soldiers from the Kieffer commando unit landed.

The British cemetery in Hermanville-sur-Mer

1,005 Allied soldiers are buried in the British cemetery. Most of the soldiers died on 6 June or on the days following the D-Day landings.

The Hillman site

The 24-hectare site with 18 bunkers and underground structures was built by the Germans between 1942 and 1944. It was the command post for their coastal defences on the Côte de Nacre.

The Grand Bunker

The Atlantic Wall Museum is housed in the former headquarters of the German army commanding the batteries in the Orne estuary. The tower was made from 5,000 tons of concrete and steel, and was unique in its kind. Standing 17 metres high and with 6 storeys, it looked down on the villas in Riva-Bella. It has been restored to show how it looked before 6 June 1944.







OUISTREHAM VILLAGE CENTRE GOING BACK IN TIME

For children aged 6 to 11

The historic heart and foundation of the town still retains its landmark appearance.

Two listed buildings in particular underline its links with the past: the monumental Roman Catholic church and the impressive Grange aux Dîmes (tithe barn).

School group visit: the village's origins (Middle Ages), Church and Grange aux Dîmes (tithe barn), the old fishermen's quarter in the 19th and 20th centuries

Content: explanations on the barn, church, ancient graffiti, how the village developed around the old fishing community.

Learning objectives: observation, comparison between past and present using vintage photos, discovery of past seafaring life.



OUISTREHAM HARBOUR

1h/1h30 (with lighthouse visit option)45 min for Kindergarten groups

THE OCCUPATION AND LIBERATION OF OUISTREHAM

Ouistreham Riva Bella, located in the Sword Beach area, is a Memorial site where, in the early hours of June 6, 1944, 177 French soldiers fought bravely under the orders of Commander Kieffer. This unit, part of the 4th British Commando, liberated part of our city. Two museums, one of them listed as a Historical Monument, narrate this particular event.

Learning objectives: Understanding a historical event/imagining, remembering, reflecting on the life of children in Ouistreham during German Occupation (based on testimonies).

A guide can take the group to visit the main headstones of Colleville Montgomery + the Hillman Site at Colleville Montgomery



HISTORY OF OUISTREHAM SEASIDE RESORT

CAEN STONE

Walking tour

Caen stone is a limestone rock with qualities that have been known since Antiquity. Its finest ambassador was without doubt William the Conqueror, who took it with him during his conquest of England in the 11th century. It was used to build prestigious monuments and buildings not only in Caen (the two abbeys and the castle), but also in England (Westminster Abbey, the Tower of London), Belgium, Holland, Germany and Italy. The stone was again used for restoration work on Saint-Peter's Church, among others.



THE RECONSTRUCTION

Caen was at the centre of air raids during the World War II, and many districts were completely destroyed. The Reconstruction programme headed by the urban planner Brillaud de Laujardière gave a new face to the city: new transport routes, enhancement of the historic heritage, the construction of residential areas and new monuments (the University, Saint-Julien's Church). This is an invitation to understand and explore the metamorphosis of the city as it was reborn from its ashes like a phoenix.



PRIVATE MANSIONS IN CAEN

Caen was the home of a large number of noble and bourgeois families who had private mansions built for them. Despite the destruction from air raids in 1944, you can still admire a number of them in the city-centre districts. Each house can be placed in its original urban context. The different types of private mansions are an opportunity to retrace the history of urban planning in pre-war Caen.



THE SEASIDE **VILLAS**

If there is a feature characterising the Normandy beaches, it is surely the seaside architecture, with Lion-sur-mer and Hermanville-sur-mer as fine examples. SWORD BEACH, ONE OF THE **D-DAY LANDING BEACHES**

Walking tour

Relive the Occupation and the Liberation of Ouistreham Riva-Bella. This is a chance to take a look at a sometimes little-known event and yet one that is unique in French history, of «Kieffer's green berets», the 177 French soldiers from the N°4 Franco-British Commando who landed on the morning of 6 June and liberated the city.



THE BATTLE OF CAEN

A visit to understand the decisive days when the city's destiny was played out. The battle to liberate Caen led to 12 days of fires, 44 days of siege and 72 days of air raids, with nearly 2,000 dead and 80% of the area destroyed. The visit explores the daily lives of the inhabitants of Caen in June and July 1944, in their mourning and hope. It will be illustrated by a visit to the permanent exhibition at the Men's Abbey, entitled "Un été 44, la vie continue" ("Summer 44, life goes on").







THE PORT OF CAEN

Coach tour

Caen harbour is a flourishing area taking part in the changes to the urban and suburban areas of Caen. This original and fascinating visit will take you from the centre of Caen to the ferry terminal of Ouistreham Riva-Bella to explore the history of the port, as linked to the history of the city, and the site's economic activity (shipbuilding, sailing, cross-Channel ferries).



THE PORT OF OUISTREHAM RIVA-BELLA

Walking tour

Discover the Port of Ouistreham and its various facets: fishing port and its traditional fish market, marina and its 650 rings nestled in a green setting, commercial port and its amazing cargo ships, commercial harbour and its surprising ballet of cargo boats, and finally a cross-Channel port with the liners of the company Brittany Ferries which liven up the outer harbour in the stoneware of their 3 daily rotations.

This part of Normandy is an occasion to take a peaceful break in a preserved setting. It stands out with its jagged landscapes sculpted by the River Orne and the erosion of the Armorican Massif. The hilly shapes combine green forests, plains and granite rock, providing a peaceful and ever-changing landscape. A stay here is always filled with harmony.



FALAISE

Falaise, with its exceptional heritage, takes us back to the origins of medieval Normandy. The castle, residence of the Dukes of Normandy, looks out over the region majestically and bears witness to a glorious past. Taking into account the fact that all services sold by the Tourist Office are limited in time, these services can never be extended beyond the specified date.

Group numbers must be provided upon booking and confirmed 48 hours before the service begins. Customers will be charged for the total number of people confirmed 48 hours before arrival, even if fewer people

2.2.2 - For group package days

The prices given apply from Monday to Saturday (Sunday and bank holidays on request), based on 40 people, subject to availability and changes to the VAT rate. The driver takes part free of charge. These prices do not include transport or personal spendina.

Article 3: Retractation

Article 6: Modification and cancellation conditions

6.1 By the client

In the event of a significant alteration and should the group exceed the limit of 20 people, the Tourist Office reserves the right to consider it as a cancellation caused by the client and apply the cancellation terms outlined above. In all cases, a basic minimum package will be charged should the group have fewer than 20 people.

If the stay is cut short by the client, no refund can be given.

Article 7: Lateness/Additional hours

The Tourist Office is legally responsible for the services in the contract being carried out, whether the services are carried out by the Tourist Office itself or by other service providers, without infringing on its right to take legal action against them.

The Tourist Office cannot be held responsible for mistakes in reservations due to the client or caused by exceptional and inevitable circumstances, from the total or partial failure to carry out the services ordered in a case of force majeure, as described in article 6 of the present GSC, due to a third party, to failure to respect their obligations by the clients, or if they are in error

Clients must inform the Tourist Office as soon as possible about circumstances of this kind, and of any non-conformity noted when a service is being carried out that is included in the contract. The Tourist Office cannot be held responsible for difficulties of any kind resulting from the temporary unavailability of the site or an interruption of the client's internet connection during the registration, reservation or paument process
